

Vaccines for Children

Vaccinations are not only important for the health of kids throughout childhood and teen years; they are also (with rare exception) the law. In the state of North Carolina, vaccination records are checked at various stages (enrollment in child care facility, kindergarten, 7th grade entry, and college/university entry) to ensure that the child has received all vaccinations appropriate for their age group. Children are not allowed to attend public, private, or religious schools without appropriate vaccinations. More information can be found [here](#).
